






# Save vs. Splurge

SKY	<p><b>Observation Deck</b></p> <p>For an inexpensive – \$6 per adult – panoramic view of the city, head to the <b>Top of the World Observation Level</b> on the 27th floor of Baltimore's World Trade Center.</p> 	<p><b>Helicopter</b></p> <p>To get a real bird's-eye view of the city, charter a private chopper through <b>Charm City Helicopters</b>, starting at \$139 per person.</p> 
SEA	<p><b>Water Taxi</b></p> <p>For a mini maritime adventure, hop aboard the <b>Baltimore Water Taxi</b>, \$16 for an all day pass. Travel between must-see hot spots and historic sites like the Inner Harbor, Fort McHenry and Fell's Point.</p> 	<p><b>Cruise</b></p> <p>Dine, dance and take in the sights from a luxury yacht operated by <b>Spirit Cruises</b>. Spirit's hours-long tours start at \$39.90 per person and provide sweeping views of the Chesapeake Bay and Patapsco River.</p> 
LAND	<p><b>Electric Scooter</b></p> <p>Download the mobile app for <b>Bird</b> or <b>Lime</b>, two scooter companies serving Baltimore, and for as little as \$1 you can unlock a set of wheels for touring the city.</p> 	<p><b>Segway</b></p> <p>With <b>Segs in the City</b>, you can roll through Baltimore on a \$60, 90-minute guided tour of the historic Fell's Point waterfront, stylish Harbor East and bustling Federal Hill.</p>
